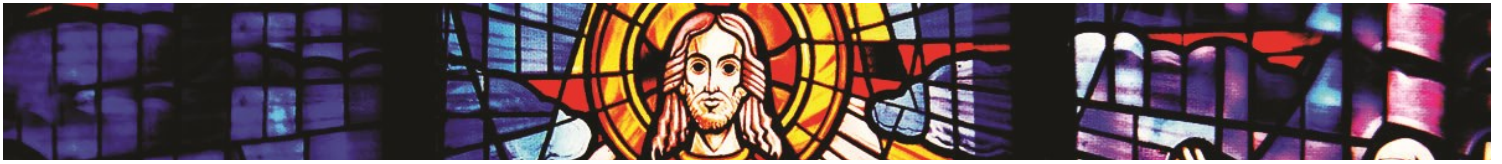

FROM THE DESK OF FR. ALFONSE...

The Rich and the Poor. Let's get one thing straight right from the very beginning. Contrary to popular belief, the rich man did not go to hell because he was rich. Nor did the poor man go to heaven because he was poor. Lazarus went to heaven because he was a good man. The rich man went to hell because he was not.

With that said, it would be naïve for us to think there is no correlation between condition in life and attitude towards life. The Lord made it clear there is when he said: "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God" (Mk 10:25).

Something happens to us when we become rich or influential, beautiful or sexy, popular or famous. We become smug, arrogant, boastful, brash, self-assured, self-confident, swaggering, conceited, self-satisfied, over confident. So the problem with being rich (or beautiful) is that it can quickly go to our head before it goes to our heart. It can make us think we are better than others; more worthy than others; more entitled than others.

As soon as I read today's parable, I was reminded of an observation Victor Hugo once made: "There is always more misery among the lower class than humanity among the upper class" (Les Miserables).



We must be careful with our wealth and what it can do to us.

How do you see things? I find it interesting how Lazarus would sit near the door of the rich man. What would the rich man say to poor Lazarus? How would he treat him? What would he give to him? Apparently, it was the minimum. It was not good enough. When someone has been entrusted with much, even more will be required (cf. Lk 12:48).

We are all poor. And we are all poor in the things that matter most: faith, hope and love. Is there any wonder why we are starving for happiness, friendship and love?

What can we do? Let's stop using people like things and placing ourselves above others. Let's start doing what we were told do so long ago: to love God above all things and to love one another as the Lord has loved us.

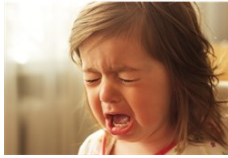

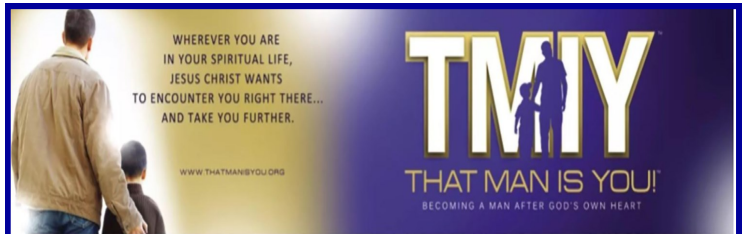

2020 Stewardship Renewal of Time, Talent and Treasure

We all have been given great power by God in the form of Time, Talents, and Treasure. Today's readings remind us that this power is meant to be used for great good. We see the urgency for us to put our powers to good use in today's Gospel passage from Luke. Our Lord tells the rather chilling parable of the rich man who ignored poor Lazarus during their lifetimes. At the moment of the rich man's death, he goes down to the netherworld while Lazarus is taken to the eternal joy and comfort in the bosom of Abraham. The rich man keenly regrets his indifference towards the needs of Lazarus, but it is too late for regret.

So how can we use our great powers for great good? By putting God first in all areas of our lives — in the way we spend our time, the ways we share our talents, the ways we give of our financial resources. A Stewardship way of life calls us out of our comfort zone and into commitment to the Lord and the things that matter to Him.

We are in the process of our annual parish Stewardship Renewal. It is the time of year when we make written commitments to prayer, parish ministries, and offertory giving - time, talent, and treasure. Check your mailbox for a package of materials that explain what stewardship means at All Saints. Our goal is to be a Stewardship Parish - a community who is noticeably committed to prayer, parish ministry, and generous financial support.

During the next week, reflect on what stewardship means in your life and how you can answer Jesus' call to discipleship. Are you are involved at All Saints? Do you serve in parish ministries? Do you come to parish-wide events? Are you taking steps to improve your spiritual life and further study our Catholic Faith? The Commitment Card you will receive in the mail offers suggestions for how you can take a step forward in all these areas.

Next Sunday is Commitment Sunday, when as a parish community we will offer God our gifts of time, talent and treasure.

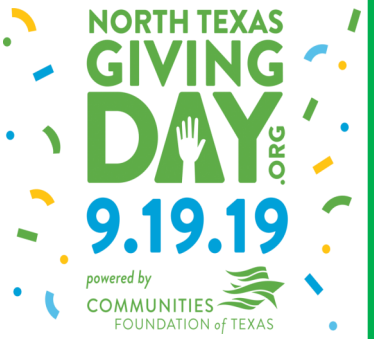
