

ALL FOR A GOOD CAUSE

Like most Catholic schools, All Saints builds its annual budget with a known “gap” between tuition income and the cost of providing an outstanding Catholic education. This year the gap is approximately \$2,700 per student.

Each year we bridge the gap through fundraising. Our winter Auction is always our largest fundraiser, but in recent years North Texas Giving Day has become our primary fall semester appeal. **This year was our most successful ever!** More than **250** Friends of All Saints donated over **\$58,000** – including \$18,000 in matching funds from a special member of the All Saints family. Many thanks to all who contributed!

Because the All Saints community exceeded the challenge set by Fr. Alfonse and Dr. McCorkle, our intrepid leaders found themselves covered in pies and slime during an all-school pep rally on Thursday.

Survey Says . . .

Last year All Saints families were invited to participate in a school survey conducted for the Diocese of Dallas by the Oklahoma Center for Education Policy at Oklahoma University. The results are now in, and All Saints did very well on many metrics of educational quality.

The survey revealed that parents believe that All Saints teachers set high expectations for students, are good at teaching, engage students in meaningful learning, and go the extra mile to help students be successful. Parents feel that they are informed about school events/activities, that teachers work with parents to meet the learning needs of the students, that they have opportunities to express concerns about school issues, and that the school administration listens to parent concerns. Overall, parents are very satisfied with the school community but would like to see higher quality extracurricular activities at the school. This year, All Saints is offering Chess Club, Soccer, Sylvan STEM, Mad Science, Robotics, Royale Ballet, Young Chef Academy, Artsy Adventures, PSIA, and Drama Club.

Growing Young Leaders

An often underappreciated advantage of attending a small Catholic school is the frequent opportunity for leadership development. Every time a student takes the hand of a young prayer buddy, stands at the podium at school mass to read the Prayers of the Faithful, serves as a PreK aide, participates in a lively debate in Mrs. LeBlanc's history class, performs in the Living Stations, or completes a corporal work of mercy, a young leader is being formed.

This year through a program we are calling "Eagles Nests," our students will have yet another opportunity to develop leadership skills while building relationships between grade levels. The student body will be divided into several "nests" – each nest comprising a few students from each of grades K-8. The nests will meet four times each year, during the school day, for activities which may include games, a religious video with discussion, holiday activities, or athletics. The eighth graders in each nest will lead the activities. Students will stay in the same nest throughout their years at ASCS, with new kindergarteners added to existing nests each year and 7th graders stepping into the leadership role when 8th graders graduate. We are excited for the long-term benefits this program will bring to each student and to our school community as a whole.
